


1803 – 1918: Every nation with a known policy prohibited abortion



Blue: Nations and territories prohibiting abortion

White: No known policy

Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (1921-1991): 278,527,000 Abortions




1920: First nation to authorize, doing so on demand

1955: Re-authorized abortion on demand (black)


Percent of independent countries, by year, that authorized abortion, and their status today as developed or developing.


Percent of independent countries authorizing abortion




Blue line: Developed nations authorizing abortion (over 90% by 2016)


Red line: Developing nations authorizing abortion (69% by 2016)







Americas & the Caribbean (35 nations): National Policies in 2016









Abortion Worldwide Report:

The Abortion Data

Data: 4,915 country-years: Reported: 3,596 country-years

Estimated by authors: 1,319 country-years

Data sources:

- Primary government sources (27.0%)
- Intergovernmental organizations: UN, COE, EU, PAHO, World Bank (46.9%)
- Peer-reviewed academic publications (23.3%)
 [as secondary sources of official data]
- Other sources: AGI, media reported of official statistics (2.8%)

82 countries + 18 territories = 100

Methodologies for Estimating Missing Data


3 Categories:

- Missing data between year of abortion authorization and first reported data;
- 2 Missing data intermediate to reported data (between reported years);
- Missing data between most recent reported data and the present (2015).

Methodologies:

- 1. Linear interpolation (1, 2)
- 2. Two-step linear interpolation (1)
- 3. Exponential interpolation (2)
- 4. Recent year model (3)
- 5. Special country cases (8 countries)

Western Europe: >99%


Eastern Europe/former USSR: >99%

1920s - 1940s: comparatively low; 1950s - 1980s: rapid rise to peak at 27.5 million annually; 1992- present: decline after collapse of communism

Current worldwide known abortions


12.5 million per year

241,000 every 1 week = Algerian Civil War (1991 – 2002)

1,046,000 every 1 month = Korean War (1950 – 1953)

6,276,000 every 6 months = Holocaust during World War II



1920: U.S.S.R.: 1st nation in history in authorize abortion 1920s-1940s: Low abortions, limited authorizations, except U.S.S.R. and Japan

1950s-1980s: higher number of authorizations, rapid increasing abortions 1990s-2010s: declining overall abortions after collapse of Soviet communism






Induced Abortions as a Percentage of Known Pregnancies, 2014




Abortion Percentages: Actual Compared to GI/WHO Study

- 12.5 vs. 56.4 million ???
- GI/WHO study claims 56.4 M abortions/year;
- 4 times higher than known abortions at 12.5 M/year
- Koch et al studies (2012) discredited methodology and results
- Implausible!






China, People's Republic of (1956-2015): 382,752,112 Abortions




1957 & 1962: 1st abortion authorizations

1979: 1-child policy


Black columns are years the government modified its abortion policies






Grey columns: some state authorizations, mostly limited: 1954, 1966-70, 72

1975: partial authorization of abortion 1996: abortion authorized on demand


Developing Nations: High Trend and Low Trend




Five country groups used for trend analysis (number of countries in parentheses):

Poland (1955-2015): 6,293,000 Abortions




Abortions fell dramatically when Poland highly restricted abortion.

Churches and synagogues: Uphold the truth, support, educate ... help and minister to girls and women in crisis pregnancies, and minister to post-abortive women and men.

Couples: Be faithful to each other, cherish and protect every child from conception

Individuals: Fear and love God. Love people. Cherish life. Live purely. Encourage ...
